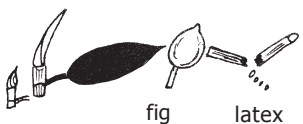
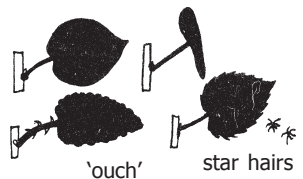

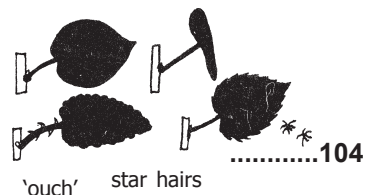
LEAVES SIMPLE *or* 1-FOLIOLATE: ALTERNATE,  
MARGINS ANGLED *or* LOBED



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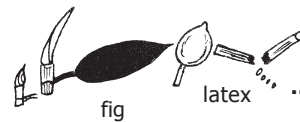
LEAVES SIMPLE: ALTERNATE *and either* PLANTS
